

Tibberton Parish Council

DRAFT Minutes

Tuesday 12th July 2022 at 7.45 p.m. at Taynton & Tibberton Village Hall

1. **Welcome from the Chairman.** Present CA, CB, TB, HK, DN – Apologies CW
2. **Minutes of the last meeting** held on 10th May 2022, draft copy published after last meeting and now signed as a true record. Published signed copy to the website. Matters arising:
 - a. Jubilee lunch at Taynton and Tibberton Hall “was a triumph” enjoyed by all who attended. Roadside post signs placed through the village were well received.
3. **Declarations of Interest:** None declared
4. **County Council Report** - Cllr Philip Robinson reported:
 - a. Encouraged Council to consider making an application to the £600,000 Community Speedwatch Safety Fund will give communities the tools they need to combat speeding in their areas. The fund aims to make the county’s roads safer for the pedestrians, cyclists and motorists who use them.
 - b. Child services OFSTED report goes highlights the relentless drive for improvement and significant financial investment made by the council, which has resulted in children being better protected.
 - c. GCC has supported over 800 Ukraine refugees in the county including 260 children now settled in schools.
 - d. The Women’s Cycling Tour of Britain has been a well-received event and benefitted hospitality businesses through the county. We look forward to the visit of the Men’s tour later this year on the 9th September.
5. **Parish Business**
 - a. Correspondence and notifications of activities and resources from GCC, FoDDC, GAPTC, GRRC circulated by email to councillors since the last meeting.
 - b. Current Statement of Accounts for 2022/2023 circulated & acknowledged showing income and expenditure within budget and on projection for the year.
 - c. Payments in July include Clerk Salary, Grass Cutting contractor. Jubilee lunch donation to Taynton & Tibberton Village Hall of £240.
 - d. Insurance – to include increased value of TPC assets as a result of the acquisition of the MVAS. Cover to include all risks increasing the premium to £254.29. Policy schedule and updated Asset register published to the website.
6. **Planning**

Reports on planning comments – Councillor Nutting

 - a. P0719/22/PQ3PA - Change of use and conversion of an existing agricultural building to one large dwelling house and one small dwelling house. Agricultural Building, Meredith Lane, Tibberton, Gloucestershire – No comment.
 - b. P0628/22/FUL – Erection of two-storey extension connecting to main dwelling by glazed link extension with associated works. Demolition of timber barn. Cannons Huntley Road Tibberton Gloucestershire GL19 3AB – No comment.

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- c. P0849/22/FUL - Conversion of redundant agricultural buildings to four dwellings with associated works. Poole Farm, Huntley Road, Tibberton, Gloucestershire. Councillors commented that an additional four homes will mark an increase of none agricultural traffic on the narrow lanes and Huntley Road. Consideration must be given to the impact on users of the PROW through the site. Councillors agreed to raise awareness with neighbours of this planning application and consider making comments before the deadline date.
- d. Clerk gave a feedback on the progress of the Tibberton Village Design Statement update and the development of the District Local plan and other reports. In addition, feedback on the Local Plan Residential Design Guide invited tour to housing developments in Dymock, Newent, Mitcheldean and Drybrook.

7. Items discussed:

- a. Update on MVAS project installation – Councillors Ackerman & Woodard
MVAS has been used in two locations in the village helping to raise awareness of vehicle speed in the village. Its next location will be the by the Old School on Tibberton Lane. SWARCO Engineers have visited the site twice and adjustments to the setting are ongoing. Data collection is ongoing and early attempts to report on vehicle numbers and speeds are encouraging.
- b. Verge opposite Orchard Rise and trees that are either dead or dying – Councillor Nutting
There are lime, hornbeam, beech and maple trees. Suggestions including removing the ailing hawthorn trees and replace with simpler trees to create a nice avenue. Clerk confirmed contractor costs to carry out various options and councillors queried responsibility and ownerships of the land and boundary. No decision pending investigation by the Clerk.
- c. Orchard Rise bank hedge, council agreed that work advised by the contractor on maintenance of the hedge should be carried out.
- d. Bramble Close verge owned by Guinness Housing Association - Council commented on the correspondence regarding recent incidents involving lack of maintenance and the hazardous boulders alongside Bramble close. Council agreed to contact the owners and investigate ways in which maintenance could be carried out more frequently.

- b. Investigate repair and tidy up of the bench by Orchard Rise triangle.
